SUMMARY ANNUAL REPORT FOR PUGET SOUND ELECTRICAL WORKERS 401(k) SAVINGS PLAN

This is a summary of the annual report for the Puget Sound Electrical Workers 401(k) Savings Plan, EIN 91-6180326, Plan No. 001, for the year ended May 31, 2018. The annual report has been filed with the Department of Labor, as required under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Basic Financial Statement

Benefits under the plan are provided by the Trust. Plan expenses were \$14,819,892. These expenses included \$829,717 in administrative expenses and \$13,990,175 in benefits paid to participants and beneficiaries. Administrative expenses include administration fees, investment fees, auditing fees, attorney fees, banking fees, consulting fees and miscellaneous expenses. A total of 6,870 persons were participants in or beneficiaries of the plan at the end of the plan year, although not all of these persons had yet earned the right to receive benefits.

The value of plan assets, after subtracting liabilities of the plan, was \$293,716,771 as of May 31, 2018, compared to \$259,030,466 as of June 1, 2017. During the plan year, the plan experienced an increase in its net assets of \$34,686,305. This increase includes unrealized appreciation or depreciation in the value of plan assets; that is, the difference between the value of the plan's assets at the end of the year and the value of the assets at the beginning of the year or the cost of assets acquired during the year. The plan had total income of \$49,506,197, including employer contributions of \$15,273,499, participant contributions of \$4,986,352, other contributions of \$336,391, earnings from investments of \$28,909,890 and other income of \$65.

You have the right to receive a copy of the full annual report, or any part thereof, on request. The items listed below are included in that report:

1. An accountant's report;
2. Financial information and information on payments to service providers;
3. Assets held for investment;
4. Transactions in excess of 5% of plan assets; and
5. Insurance information, including sales commissions paid by insurance carriers.

You also have the right to receive from the plan administrator, on request and at no charge, a statement of the assets and liabilities of the plan and accompanying notes, or a statement of income and expenses of the plan and accompanying notes, or both. If you request a copy of the full annual report from the plan administrator, these two statements and accompanying notes will be included as part of that report. The charge to cover copying costs given above does not include a charge for the copying of these portions of the report because these portions are furnished without charge.

You also have the legally protected right to examine the annual report at the main office of the plan, 7525 SE 24th Street, Suite 200, Mercer Island, Washington, 98040, and at the U.S. Department of Labor in Washington, DC, or to obtain a copy from the U.S. Department of Labor upon payment of copying costs.
